I'm delighted to be able to share with you news of the Study In Canada Scholarships program, which is being coordinated at Queen's by the Office of the Vice-Provost, International:

### **Study In Canada Scholarships**

The call for applications to the Study In Canada Scholarship program, run by EduCanada, has now opened. The Study In Canada Scholarships program aims to increase opportunities for Canadian post-secondary institutions to welcome international students from a wide range of countries and territories on short-term exchanges for study or research.

Successful candidates will receive scholarships for four months or one academic term of study or research at the college, undergraduate or graduate levels or for five to six months of study or research at the graduate level.

Successful Canadian post-secondary institutions will have the opportunity to strengthen and diversify their international linkages and to promote their academic and research excellence in the new markets, in line with the objectives of the International Education Strategy.

*Please note that the current [suspension of university-sponsored travel](#) is still in place. This competition is being run by external organizations – EduCanada – in the hope that COVID-19 restrictions on travel will be eased within the terms of the award. Please prepare your application with the expectation that current COVID-19 restrictions on travel will no longer apply by the time student mobility is due to take place.*

All applications from Queen's University must be submitted by the Office of the Vice-Provost, International, on behalf of candidates. There is no limit to the number of candidates per university.

The internal deadline for applications is **Friday, March 5, 2021**. An adjudication committee chaired by the Vice-Provost, International will then rank eligible applications based on the strategic priorities outlined by the Principal in '[Components of an Emerging Strategy: A Report on the Conversation](#).'
