CLICK@Queen's

(Connect, Learn, Identify, Change, Know Adaptive Technology)

Dear Parents/Guardians:

Thank you for your interest in the CLICK@Queen's (Connect, Learn, Identify, Change, Know Adaptive Technology) program offered by the Regional Assessment and Resource Centre (RARC) at Queen's University. CLICK@Queen's is a 3-day program for students with neurodevelopmental conditions affecting learning (such as learning disabilities and ADHD) to learn about adaptive technologies and have fun with games and prizes. The program takes place July 17-19, 2023 from 9am-3:30pm. Pick-up is available until 4pm. The fee for CLICK@Queen's is \$200, and includes lunch for all three days of the program.

Here at RARC, we have been running transition programs for over 15 years. Our experience has shown us that by providing students a deeper understanding of the one's learning profile and challenges, teaching about adaptive technology and other accommodations, and promoting self-advocacy, it increases student success at secondary school and beyond.

The CLICK@Queen's program includes:

- Student sessions focusing on adaptive technology, self-understanding and self-advocacy
- Optional parent training sessions
- Fun and games

Eligibility Requirements:

To be eligible for the CLICK@Queen's program, students must:

- Be entering grade 8 or 9 in fall 2023
- Have impairments in academic achievement
- Be previously diagnosed with a learning disability and/or ADHD, or have a history that strongly suggests a learning disability or ADHD

Acceptance in the CLICK@Queen's Program:

There are a limited number of spaces in the CLICK@Queen's program and applications will be screened and scored to determine acceptance into the program.

Cost:

The fee for this program is \$200, which includes lunch on each day. Payment can be made by credit card, debit or e-transfer once a student has been accepted and confirmed into the program. Payment is due by April 30, 2023 and is not refundable.

Out of Town Accommodations:

In order to accommodate out of town participants, a room block has been reserved at the Queen's University student residences. Families can book these rooms (with a special code given upon acceptance into the program) at the rate of \$129/night. No programming or chaperoning is provided for students outside of regular camp hours.
