The highlight was our JDUC grand re-opening celebration, which featured the student band, *Last Call*, a photobooth, cake, Tricolour yearbooks and Queen's Journal bound volumes on display, self-guided tours of the building, and, of course, the Queen's Pub and Society 68 were open for business. The building opening was ceremonially commemorated with speeches from the AMS President and myself, Principal, and Vice Principal (Finance & Administration), before all present were welcomed to participate in the ribbon cutting. Committees | Here are all my available committee updates:



No member raised any concerns or asked for changes. The vote for approval on this policy will come to AMS Assembly's second November meeting, and the SGPS Councils meeting on November 11.
- **National Day for Truth and Reconciliation Working Group:** the committee recently debriefed the programming and events from this year and is having early discussions about next year. If you have any feedback to share, please reach out to me. My Office also recently took down the orange hearts outside the JDUC and Richardson Hall in anticipation of the weather declining. We are considering options for them moving forward, and right now leaning towards re-planting the garden come spring time. Again, open to your ideas!
