We've made it to the last Assembly of the calendar year! I hope you are all winding down your society operations and making more time to study for exams and write final papers. Rest up and enjoy time with family and friends over the holidays. My team and I will be away from December 20 – January 5, though I will continue to take requests for the Rector's Bursary and any other urgent matters.

Office | We onboarded two new interns, and they have hit the ground running, helping with logistics for the Tricolour Award, social media listening, and began setting up the groundwork for a new project. Our team hosted a Q&A table for the Tricolour Award nomination packages, finalized the Student Leader Development Conference recap and report, and is now booking club and community events for the new year.

Community Engagement | November kicked off with a week of [convocation ceremonies](#) for the last set of 2025 graduates. I then spoke on the student leader panel at the [University Council](#) annual meeting.
