Office | The 2026 [Agnes Bendickson Tricolour Award](#) recipients are Emils Matiss, Bisola Olaseni, Oluwamisimi (Simi) Oluwole, and Daniel (Dan) Reddy. They have each contributed in distinct and inspiring ways, enhancing the student experience at Queen's and leaving a legacy that will be felt well beyond their time here. Thank you to the [Selection Committee](#) for their service. My team is busy planning for the Tricolour reception as well as other projects related to improving student support and study spaces.

Community Engagement | The University asked me to delegate at Kingston City Council and speak in support of the Alto high-speed rail project along the Québec–Toronto corridor. I emphasized the compelling case for ensuring Kingston is included as a stop, asking for the corridor to be closer to our city center to maximize accessibility and minimize disruption to the environment. I also submitted a [letter as part of the Bill 33 consultations](#) with support from several student society leaders. Once we learn how exactly the Schedule 3 amendments to the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities Act will require changes to our current practices, the administration, in collaboration with the AMS and SGPS, will respond.

Board of Trustees | At the time of writing this, the Board has not yet met for our March meetings, but I can provide a verbal update at Assembly.
