Thank you to everyone involved in making the event a success, from those who attended, volunteered, and sponsored. We also rented out the JDUC Polson room for April 1-3 open study, in response to an apparent need for more spaces on campus, and successfully worked with the university to allow for students to use classroom spaces during the exam period. Since the AMS Assembly and SGPS Council approved the new Rector's Election Policy (2025), my team applied the approved edits, cleaning up grammar errors and updating with the current AMS policy format standards, and handed it off to the AMS Information Management Specialist. - **Board-Senate Advisory Committee:** the annual retreat planned by this committee was very fruitful. The theme this year was "interdisciplinarity". Senators and Trustees heard success stories from a panel of faculty members and then discussed current challenges with our system and opportunities to improve and expand upon interdisciplinary work.
