I have previously completed a Bachelor of Fine Art and Bachelor of Education. I am now perusing a Master of Education while I serve my term as Rector. During my now six years at Queen's, I have worked for the Alma Mater Society, Undergraduate Admissions, University Relations, and the Human Rights and Equity Office. Prior to joining the Queen's Board of Trustees, I served as the Vice Chairperson of the AMS Board where I chaired the Governance Committee and was appointed to the Queen's Journal Advisory Board to oversee their finances and do a mass overhaul of their governing policy.

Office | My Office team includes a First Year Intern, Communications and Engagement Officer, and Multimedia Producer. Their support this year has enabled me to work on my election campaign platform goals. We now officially work out of the JDUC in room 224. This summer, we will be conducting two review committees, for the Rector Election Policy and Tricolour Award Selection Process. As well as some other projects relating to the Rector's Bursary, website updates, and preparing for the second annual Student Leader Development Conference.

Community Engagement | We helped get students out to vote for the Federal Election through [social media promotion](#) of the on-campus booth. I presented the Jeffrey McCarthy Award for outstanding contributions to the club community at the AMS Awards Gala to Joey Lauer.

Board of Trustees | The Board of Trustees met for their last quarterly session of the school year. As always, I coordinated a meeting with a group of student leaders from the AMS and SGPS, and Senate, to meet with myself and the Board Chair to discuss important student issues and ask questions in an informal environment.
