**Office Staff** | I have hired two staff members (an undergraduate and graduate student) to support the work I hope to achieve this year. These roles, a Multimedia Producer and Communications & Engagement Officer, will allow me to further my outreach and impact across campus in a sustainable way while balancing my academic requirements and goals. **UDSI Awareness** | In an effort to make students aware of the <u>City of Kingston University District Safety Initiative</u> (UDSI), I worked with the AMS, ASUS, EngSoc, and HSS to create a <u>video</u> explaining the basics. During the two-week window of the UDSI, we reached over 10 thousand accounts (90% non-followers), gained 22 thousand views and over 130 shares. <u>The Journal reported</u> UDSI-related fines totalling \$16,920. The number of tickets for parking and trespassing at the pier stood out to me so I connected with University Relations and Student Affairs (who create paid harm reductions campaigns) and asked them to consider adding assets for parking and the pier next year.

**Hate Has No Home Here** | I have partnered with Hill Werth, Ed'24 to be a diplomat of the <u>HHNHH campaign</u>. This poster is a marker of a safe space for marginalized community members. Hill is providing Queen's and Kingston businesses with a way to stand strong together against. A 2024 recipient of <u>Kingston 40 under 40 Award</u>, Hill's impactful poster has even caught the attention of the House of Commons. My office did a 225-print run for student government and club spaces, the

Division of Student Affairs, and all residence buildings. If you would like a copy for your space, I can provide you with a poster at AMS Assembly.
