THE PRINCE TAKAMADO VISITING STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

Application Form

Queen's University is honoured to join with the Canadian Embassy in Japan in establishing The Prince Takamado Visiting Student Scholarship at Queen's University - a fitting tribute to a loyal alumnus who dedicated so much of his life to fostering a strong relationship between Canada and Japan.

His Imperial Highness Prince Takamado (1954-2002) was a good friend and is a distinguished alumnus of Queen's University. During his years at Queen's, Prince Takamado embraced the opportunity to learn, eager to master the English language and understand Canadian culture. Upon his return to Japan, Prince Takamado strengthened his connection to Canada, becoming a patron of the Canada-Japan Society, and promoting business and cultural links between Canada and Japan. In 1992, Queen's University awarded His Imperial Highness an honorary degree, in recognition of his major contribution to the mutual understanding and appreciation of the cultures of the peoples of Japan and Canada.

The Prince Takamado Visiting Student Scholarship at Queen's University is awarded to a second or third-year student of Japanese nationality (citizen) who is currently enrolled in a Japanese university, and who will study at Queen's University on a Letter of Permission from their home university. Application should be made to Queen's University Undergraduate Admission by December 1.

Value: Approximately \$60,000 (Canadian Dollars), to be applied towards tuition and fees at Queen's University based on guidelines established by Queen's University. A guaranteed residence room will be made available to the recipient if on-campus accommodations are requested.

Please submit the following documentation to Queen's University:

- The completed Prince Takamado Visiting Student Scholarship application form and essay must be submitted by the deadline of **December 1**.
-This may be mailed or emailed by the applicant
- An official transcript from **your home university** by **December 1**.
- A satisfactory score on a test of facility in English by **December 1**. One of TOEFL, IELTS or MELAB is accepted for all programs except Law. Refer to:

- For students applying to the Faculty of Law, TOEFL is required. iBT scores are preferred: a minimum total score of 5.0 with no skill lower than 4.5. Prior to January 2026, a minimum total score of 100 was required with no less than 24 on the Writing section, no less than 22 on the Speaking Section, no less than 24 on the Reading Section and no less than 20 on the Listening Section.
- All supporting documents, including official transcripts, English-language proficiency test scores **must be sent by your home university**. Emailed documents will be accepted if they come **directly from your home institution international office**. It is recommended that supporting documents be sent to Queen's University as soon as possible, and no later than **December 1**.
