# 2013-14 Enrolment Report

as of November 1, 2013

Queen's University Senate – December 2, 2013

## On November 1 each year,

the university takes a census of enrolment for the fall term. This report provides details of our undergraduate and graduate enrolment numbers, together with additional information about our student population.

Enrolment in all first-year undergraduate programs is **4,213** (10 students above the projection) and represents a **0.5%** increase in first-year enrolment over last year.

Total undergraduate enrolment is within **1%** of the minimum projection for 2013 and has increased by **2%** over 2012; international enrolment has increased by **7%** among undergraduates.

Graduate enrolment has also increased over 2012 and came within **3%** of the minimum projection for 2013; international enrolment has increased by **4.6%** among graduate students.



## Incoming Undergraduate Class

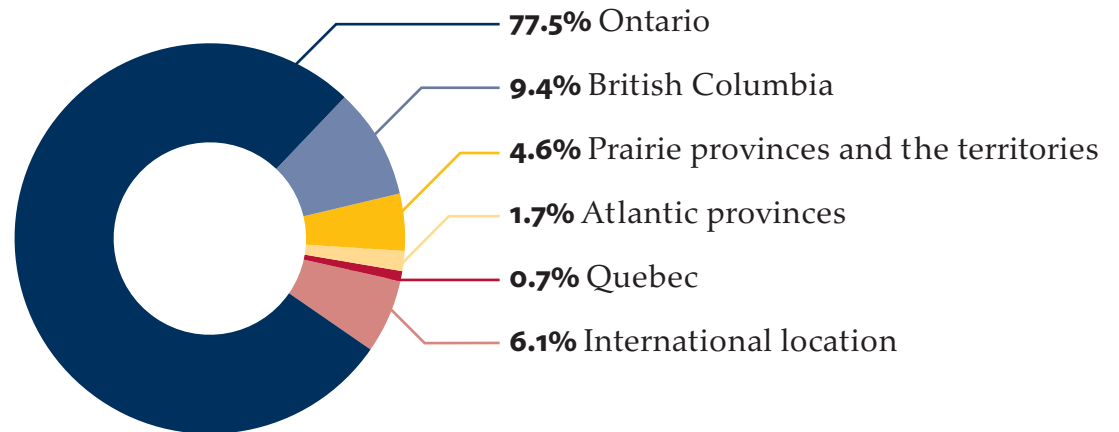
As part of direct-entry undergraduate recruiting, representatives from Queen's visited with prospective students at close to 1,000 high schools and post-secondary fairs in nine Canadian provinces, two territories, and seven U.S. states, as well as cities in India, China, Hong Kong and Turkey.

For the first time, we introduced **early offers** of admission. These are offers made on the basis of final Grade 11 marks to students with a minimum 90% average. Seventeen per cent of our offers were made between early December 2012 and mid-January 2013. This new approach is consistent with practices at many other Canadian institutions and at least one faculty has indicated that it contributed to a higher conversion rate among top-achieving students.

Increasing enrolment among Aboriginal learners is a priority for the university. The number of self-identified Aboriginal first-year undergraduate registrants is up **81%** and the student retention rate among Aboriginal learners from year 1 to year 2 is **84%**

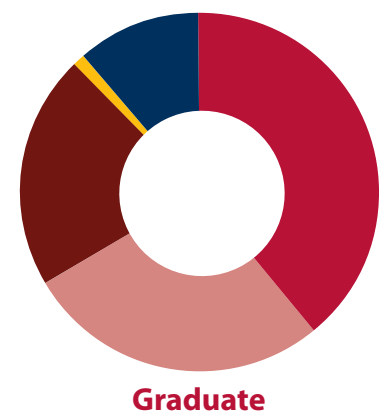
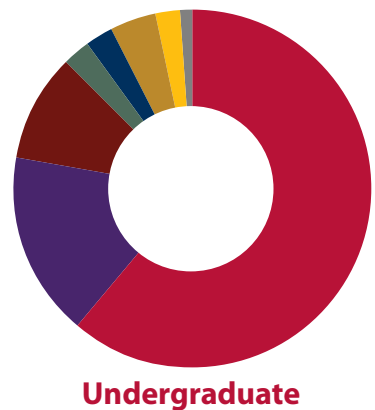

# Total Enrolment

In the Senate-approved plan for 2013-14, enrolment is forecast for all years using expected retention and progression rates. We use a range based on 1-3 year historic retention rates by program. Below is a summary of total enrolment ranges, as projected in the plan, and the actual November headcounts of full-time for-credit students.

\*\* Law has historically been included in the university's graduate counts although it is second-entry undergraduate program.

Outgoing exchange students are not counted in either the enrolment projections or the preceding table, as the Senate enrolment reports have always been headcount reports. Outgoing exchange students are included in Faculty FTE reporting. An increase in outgoing exchange students between 2012 and 2013 in both Commerce and Law accounts for the difference in planned and actual enrolment numbers for those programs.

**The 2012 7-year graduation rate:**

**85.1%** of Queen's students who had begun undergraduate study in 2005 had completed their degrees by 2012.

# Total International Enrolment

There are **1,679** for-credit full- or part-time international undergraduate and graduate students at Queen's from more than **70** countries. This is an increase of **5.7%** over 2012-13.
