The School of Religion at Queen's University invites applications from suitably qualified candidates interested in teaching an undergraduate course in Religion and Empire (RELS 201). This is an on-campus, upper level lecture course with an expected enrolment of ~50 students. The class is scheduled for Tuesdays 11:30-1:00 and Fridays 1:00-2:30.

The School of Religion at Queen's University also invites applications from suitably qualified candidates interested in teaching a graduate course in Problems in Ancient Mediterranean Religions (RELS 887). This is an on-campus, upper level lecture course with an expected enrolment of ~10 students. The class is scheduled for Mondays 11:30-2:30.

Candidates should have a Ph.D, and teaching experience at the University level in Religious Studies. This is a winter term appointment for the period January 1, 2022 to April 30, 2022, with classes in session from January 10 to April 8.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. Queen's is strongly committed to employment equity, diversity, and inclusion in the workplace and encourages applications from Black, racialized/visible minority and Indigenous/Aboriginal people, women, persons with disabilities, and 2SLGBTQ+ persons. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority.
