The School of Religion at Queen’s University invites applications from suitably qualified candidates interested in teaching an undergraduate course in **Religion, News and Media** (RELS 162). This is an on-campus lecture course with an expected enrolment of ~175 students.

Candidates should have a Ph. D, and teaching experience at the University level in Religious Studies. This is a Winter term appointment for the period January 1, 2025, to April 30, 2025, with classes in session from January 6 to April 4, 2025.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. Queen's is strongly committed to employment equity, diversity, and inclusion in the workplace and encourages applications from Black, racialized/visible minority and Indigenous/Aboriginal people, women, persons with disabilities, and 2SLGBTQ+ persons. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority.

The University will provide support in its recruitment processes to applicants with disabilities, including accommodation that takes into account an applicant’s accessibility needs. To comply with Federal laws, the University is obliged to gather statistical information about how many applicants for each job vacancy are Canadian citizens / permanent residents of Canada. Applicants need not identify their country of origin or citizenship, however, all applications must include one of the following statements: “I am a Canadian citizen / permanent resident of Canada”; OR, “I am not a Canadian citizen / permanent resident of Canada”. Applications that do not include this information will be deemed incomplete.

Applications should be submitted as one single PDF file and include a complete and current curriculum vitae, and any other relevant materials the candidate wishes to submit for consideration such as a letter of intent, teaching dossier, etc. Applications should also include letters of reference from two (2) referees. **Please arrange to have applications and supporting letters sent directly to:**
