- Archives –Conservation Lab Ceiling Leak Paint/Plaster fell Tested No hazardous material
- Maps Ceiling Hatch Tested Mold present Remediated
- Jordan Conservation Lab Odor Concern over hazardous particulates Tested No remnant gasses or particulates in the ventilation system were found
- Education Racoon in Library Facilities fixed the hole and Abel attended
- Douglas HVAC issue New chiller caused uneven temperature levels Has been addressed
- Stauffer HVAC issue High humidity and limited cooling in some areas –mostly addressed
- Stauffer Lower Level Mold present Test Remediated Retested and no signs of mold regrowth
- Douglas south emergency exit floor tiles tested contain asbestos the hallway is safe to use during evacuation – PPS has it on the list for abatement
- Education (DMH) Odor resulting in Emergency evacuation fixative used for concrete curing was the reason for the odor.
  - o Head of Education Library When the evacuation happened, Nathalie had trouble communicating with someone in Administration and the Dean was asking that the building be shut down. Couldn't get hold of Nancy who was off that day.

They had to leave the building as two staff members were complaining of headaches

- Nancy: If there was a decision to close the library, communicate with HR so that the Union can be notified. Request to include HR in any comms that go out to staff.
- Stauffer ATC Ongoing HVAC issue low temperatures in the ATC offices all summer
  Ongoing Facilities have taken responsibility for this.
  - Doug Update on ATC HVAC Facilities Operations Manager, attended the area last week and spoke with staff. Temperature readings were taken and following further conversations and investigative work by their staff, they have found a mechanical issue confirming that the air handler for this area was not working properly. Aaron attended the area again today and it was confirmed by staff that as of last week, temperatures in the area have been more comfortable. He mentions that he is still doing some work to complete his investigation.

Doug Facilities update-It took a while this summer but facilities did come in to fix slabs leading up to the Union gallery that was uneven and unsafe. These has been fixed; stones had sunk in the rotunda (tripping hazard) have been corrected within the last two weeks. What facilities are prioritizing Health and Safety issues.
