Tucked into his trunk was an oddly-shaped tin canister — called a "banjo box" by today's Queen's archivists — which contained the college's royal charter. 

STUDENT LIFE

The **Senate Student Caucus** (SSC) is an independent entity jointly defined by the Society of Graduate and Professional Students (SGPS) and the Alma Mater Society (AMS). The group consists of the 15 elected student senators_representing each faculty, the AMS president, SGPS president, both student trustees, and the rector for a total of 20 members. A chair and vice chair are elected by the caucus every March. This group serves to better organize, train, and transition senators. They meet twice a month. Once to prepare for Senate the other to discuss any issues students are seeing in the purview of senate.



The Chair this year is **Lucas Balog**, a 3rd year Mechatronics and Robotics Engineering Student and recipient of the Chancellor's Scholarship for community leadership. Lucas has set out a number of goals for this year including making the caucus more present in student leadership, reviewing the structure to better adapt to new and challenging issues, and creating a better transition plan for the yearly changeover of senators. Student voices play an integral role on Senate and its committees providing student views on current issues, better ways to implement the goals of the university, and how policy should be written.

Call to action:

Student senators often take a big leap joining senate and for many it is the first time sitting at the "adult table". The senators who come out confident and were most effective in their role are often the ones who found mentors in faculty, secretariat, and other members of Queen's governance structures. Student senators would welcome and

appreciate the ability to work with university council members who can share their advice and experience working with university governance.
