Therefore, under, III, Reports of Committees, 6 (c), a motion will be proposed by the Senate Agenda Committee "that the Functions of the Senate be considered in an informal session chaired by the Principal."

The Senate will move into Informal Session.

Format for Informal Discussion

30-45 minutes will be allotted to discuss the Functions of the Senate based on the consideration of the following questions posed by SORC:

- 1. Should Senate have an overall purpose?
- 2. SORC proposes to remove the phrase "the well-being of students" and insert it in the purpose statement. SORC thinks it is too complex to identify as a single function. What do you think?
- 3. Do the functions of Senate, as proposed, diminish the authority of Senate?
- 4. What general responses do you have to the proposed purpose and functions of Senate?

Senate Operations Review Committee

Senate Meeting of January 20, 2011 Functions of the Senate

Introduction

In 2009, the Senate Operations Review Committee (SORC) began a review of Senate composition as per its mandate to conduct a periodic review of the composition of Senate and its committees. It concluded that the review should begin with an examination of the Functions of Senate, last amended November 1982.

At SORC's request, an informal session took place at Senate on September 23, 2010 to receive input on the 1982 Functions of Senate. In addition to this input, SORC also took into consideration the recent establishment of new committees and processes (e.g., QUPC, QUQAP) and the impact of these on the existing Senate functions. Other universities' statements of Senate purposes and functions were researched and examined as peer comparisons and background information.

At the November 25, 2010 Senate meeting, SORC presented a notice of motion to consider a revised Functions of Senate. In response to community feedback, consultation and further work by SORC in December and early January, additional revisions were incorporated and a rationale for changes was added.

SORC requests that Senate discuss its revised proposal in an informal session (see questions below). SORC will consider input from this informal session and present a final proposal for Functions of Senate, accompanied by a draft Committee Structure as a notice of motion at the February 17, 2011 meeting of Senate. In February and early March, SORC will consult with Senate Committees on a Committee structure that will align with Functions of Senate. At the March 24, 2011 Senate meeting, Senators will deliberate the motion.

Following approval of a revised set of "Functions of Senate", SORC will then consider the Senate composition required to fulfill the Functions and Committee requirements.

Attached is a table comparing the current and proposed Functions of Senate, as well as the rationale for changes.

- 1. Should Senate have an overall purpose?
- 2. SORC proposes to remove the phrase "the well-being of students" and insert it in the purpose statement. SORC thinks it is too complex to identify as a single function. What do you think?
- 3. Do the functions of Senate, as proposed, diminish the authority of Senate?
- 4. What general responses do you have to the proposed purpose and functions of Senate?

PURPOSE AND FUNCTIONS OF SENATE (PROPOSED REVISIONS – January 2011)

Senate Purpose:

The Senate determines all matters of an academic character that affect the University as a whole, and is concerned with all matters that affect the general welfare of the University and its constituents.

Functions of Senate:

Legislative Functions:

- 1. To approve the establishment of any academic unit, centre or institute, subject to ratification of the Board of Trustees.
- 2. To approve the establishment of named and funded chairs and professorships, subject to ratification of the Board of Trustees.
- 3. To approve, on the recommendation of Faculty Boards and Schools, all programs of study leading to a degree, diploma, or certificate and to review programs cyclically.
- 4. To approve university-level policies relating to the academic mission.
- 5. To grant all honorary degrees and to grant on the recommendation of Faculty Boards and Schools all earned degrees, diplomas, and certificates awarded by the University.
- 6. To approve policies and procedures regarding student academic and non-academic matters. The authority to discipline students, including the power to require a student to withdraw from the University, resides with the Senate; responsibility for non-academic discipline of students may be delegated to student organizations.

Academic Planning and Educational Environment Functions:

- 7. To participate in planning the development of the University and to approve, subject to the ratification of the Board of Trustees when required, University planning proposals.
- 8. To approve the annual enrolment plan.
- 9. To approve the Strategic Research Plan, ensuring links between the research and educational mission.
- 10. To commit, through the approval of policies and programs, to the creation of an environment at the University that recognizes equity and diversity as being vital to, and in harmony, with its educational purposes and standards of excellence as an institution.

Appointment/Selection Functions:

- 11. To share with the Board of Trustees the responsibility for the selection of the Principal through a committee composed equally of members of the Senate and the Board.
- 12. To establish the procedures to be followed in the appointment of Deans and academic Vice-Principals.
- 13. To appoint, establish terms of reference, and have responsibility for committees that fulfill the functions of Senate.

Collegial Function:

14. To serve as a forum for discussion and exchange of ideas among the members of the academic community.
