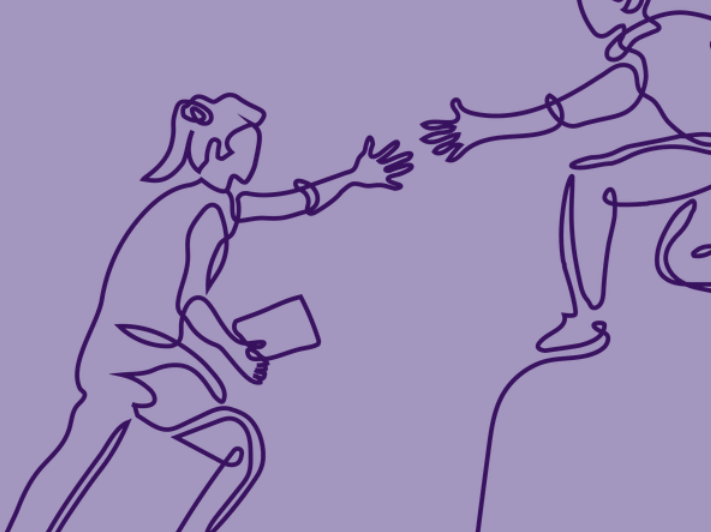

1 In an emergency

2 Medical care



KHSC - Kingston General Hospital - 76 Stuart St. Acute/Immediate Care

Option 1 – Access via emergency department if:

- The event happened within the last five days, or
- You have injuries that need medical attention

Action: Go to the emergency department and ask to see the Sexual Assault Domestic Violence team when you check in at triage.

Option 2 – Calling the SADV nurse on-call who is available to help you determine the best care option based on your situation.

This option may be right for you if:

- You need time-sensitive care (within 12 days)
- You have injuries that do not require emergency treatment
- You feel unsafe going to the emergency department

Action: Call 613-549-6666 ext. 0 and ask to speak to the SADV nurse on-call.

Non-Emergency Care

Option 3 – Outpatient clinic appointment

This option works best for:

- Events that happened more than two weeks ago
- Individuals looking for counselling, follow-up care, or community referrals
- People who prefer care scheduled at specific times

Action: Call the SADV clinic 613-549-6666 ext. 62837 to book a clinic appointment.

Services are available to people of all ages and gender identities.

Care will be provided in a private, secure setting by specially trained staff. Services are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Information about medical and counselling care options, e.g., forensic evidence collection and drug facilitated sexual assault screening, can be found on the KHSC website (See QR code).

3 Get support

For on-campus care and support, contact:
