8. Department of Physics, Engineering Physics and Astronomy

In Stirling Hall, the home of the Department of Physics, Engineering Physics and Astronomy, several existing exhibitions commemorating our department's past notable members or activities were refurbished. This included displays about the history of nuclear research at Queen's and also the work of Nathan Dupuis. Also, a new exhibit was created commemorating Edmond E. Watson, a former Engineering Physics professor who worked extensively in oceanography.

Two older posters about nuclear science were restored and conserved by the Art Conservation Department and were displayed. Two photographic montages were created and displayed; one is of the construction of Stirling Hall and the other is on the Physics Department in Ontario Hall, prior to the construction of Stirling Hall. It was hoped to create a couple more exhibits but there was insufficient time. It is hoped that these other exhibits will yet be created. We had discussed offering guided tours of these displays, as well as general tours of Stirling Hall and its design features, but this did not come to fruition this time.
