The Department of Sociology at Queen's University invites applications from suitably qualified graduate students at Queen's University interested in teaching SOCY 226 – Central Concepts in Sociological Theory. This is an on-campus lecture course with an expected enrolment of around 200 undergraduate students. This is a Fall term appointment for the period September 1, 2024 to December 31, 2024 with classes in session from September 3, 2024 – December 3, 2024.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals.
