First Year

What will my first year look like?

Students in ConEd work towards earning **2 degrees** at the same time:

1. Bachelor of Education
2. Arts & Science Bachelor's Degree

We offer 5 choices of Arts & Science degrees

- Bachelor of Arts, Honours (BAH/BEd)
- Bachelor of Science, Honours (BScH/BEd)
- Bachelor of Music (Bmus/BEd)
- Bachelor of Science, Honours, in Kinesiology (BSCH/BEd)
- Bachelor of Arts, Honours, in French Studies, (BAH/BEd)

Education Courses

- **PROF 110/3.0 Self as Teacher FW**- Introduction to schools, teaching, and curriculum in their historical, political, social and philosophical context. Exploration of policy, practice and professional portfolios, with an emphasis on reflective and critical thinking. NOTE: The Faculty of Education automatically registers ConEd students in this course.
- **EXLR 110/1.5 Experiences in Education** (60 hours)- The purpose of the first year Experiences in Education placement is to increase the candidate's awareness of broader teaching and learning settings to ensure more opportunities to experience diversity and inclusivity. Candidates in first year must complete 60 hours of educational experience in a non-traditional setting. Candidates can complete the placement(s) in 10 consecutive days, in a combination of full and half days over several weeks, or in shorter sessions throughout the year. The total placement hours must be completed in the same academic year. NOTE: ConEd students are automatically registered in this course.

ConEd students take:

- **10** Arts or Science (**5** courses each term)
 - Some courses are full-year (6.0 units) and some are half-year (3.0 units)
- **1** Education full-year course (Self as Teacher - PROF 110/3.0)
- **60 hrs** of placement
 - Experiences in Education (EXLR 110)
 - All first-year students will complete a non-traditional placement this year
- At the end of Year 1, students select either the **Primary-Junior** or **Intermediate-Senior**

Division Selection

- **Primary-Junior (PJ)** is for those intending to teach students in Junior Kindergarten to Grade 6
- **Intermediate-Senior (IS)** is for those intending to teach students in Grades 7 to 12
- **IS** students must choose **two** teaching subjects

In ConEd, you don't have to choose PJ or IS until the end of your first year!

Years 2-4 and Final Year

How does the Concurrent Education Program work?

- ConEd students have Education classes in addition to Arts and Sciences courses for the first 3 years of the program
- In year 4 you have no Education courses, it is a time to focus on finishing your Arts and Science degree or catching up if you fell behind (exchanges, etc.)

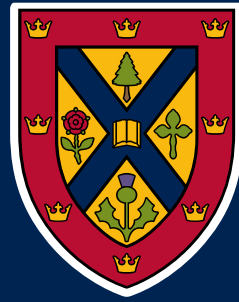
